Heard the Ld. Counsel for the Applicants Ms. Noor Saba Khan and Ld. Public Prosecutor Mr. Adamyia Chandra appearing for the State. The counsel for the applicants submits that F.I.R. No. 03/19 u/s 302/307 IPC, 1860 was registered in the Police Station Ranjit Nagar, East Delhi and that there are discrepancies in the FIR, three times, that could not be taken as the typographic error.

One separate sheet has been attached in the name of complain by the police, where to whom the complain was given is not mentioned and who has given the complain is also not mentioned that raises a serious doubt on the working of police and the SHO in this matter. Since, police could not produce any satisfactory documentary evidence that shows the involvement of the accused in the aforesaid offence, this court grants bail to all the three accused till the

filing of charge sheet by the police. Accused shall be released on the bail on furnishing the bail bond of Rupees 02 lakhs each along with the condition that the accused shall not leave the city without the prior permission of this court. The accused shall cooperate with the investigating authorities and shall not affect any witness directly or indirectly.

The application is disposed off. Copy of this order shall be given to the S.P. as well as to both the parties present.
