Counsel for the applicants submits that one FIR No. 147/19 has been registered in Ranjit Nagar Police Station on 11.09.2019 where the accused are alleged to have committed the offence under section 302/392/394 of Indian Penal Code, 1860. Police has already taken six days custody from 18.09.2019 to 24.09.2019 and thereafter accused were sent to judicial custody. Police cannot produce any *prima facie* evidence that shows involvement of the accused in the said offence. Since the charges against the accused are very grave, accused were sent to the police custody for six days still police could not produce any evidence. Ld. Counsel for the applicants further submits that there is a four days delay in registering the FIR as it is evident from the FIR that the information was received on 7.09.2019 and

FIR was registered on 11.09.2019 that raises a serious doubt on the conduct of the police.

Ld. Public Prosecutor submits that accused should not be released on bail as they can again commit the offences of like nature. It is a settled principle of law that “*Suspicion howsoever grave it is cannot take place of the settled law*”.

In the aforesaid circumstances, this court is of the opinion that there are sufficient grounds for granting bail to the accused along with the condition that the police shall file the status report on or before next date of listing to the registry. Bail is granted on the personal bond of five thousand rupees each. Put up this matter on next date of listing. Copy of order should be given interested parties as well as to the accused. With no cost to the other party.
